Early Voting is Saturday, July 27 through Sunday, August 4 from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. daily.

All precincts are handicap accessible. Voting instructions are available in alternative formats. Contact your Clerk's office for details. Please note that you will be asked to show ID when you check in. If you don't have one, you can still vote but will need to sign an affidavit of identity form if you do not have picture identification with you.

Accepted forms of identification: Michigan driver's license or state ID, driver's license or personal identification card issued by another state, federal or state government-issued photo identification, U.S. passport, Military ID with photo, student identification with photo from a high school or accredited institution of higher learning, Tribal identification card with photo.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that you will be voting on nominating candidates for the offices of: United States Senator, Representative in Congress, Representative in State Legislature, Prosecuting Attorney, Sheriff, County Clerk and Register of Deeds, County Treasurer, Public Works Commissioner, County Commissioner, Judge of Probate Court.

AND THE FOLLOWING PROPOSALS:

1. MILLAGE RENEWAL FOR OPERATION OF PARKS AND RECREATION
TOTAL AMOUNT OF TAXES WHICH MAY BE LEVIED ON ALL TAXABLE REAL AND PERSONAL PROPERTY IN THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF WASHINGTON, MACOMB COUNTY, MICHIGAN BE INCREASED BY AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED THREE-QUARTERS (3/4) OF ONE (1) MILL FOR EACH ONE (\$1.00) DOLLAR (\$0.75 FOR EACH \$1,000.00) OF THE TAXABLE VALUE OF SUCH PROPERTY FOR A PERIOD OF FOUR (4) YEARS FOR THE OPERATION OF PARKS AND RECREATION? THIS PROPOSED MILLAGE IS A RENEWAL OF A PREVIOUSLY AUTHORIZED MILLAGE.

2. MILLAGE RENEWAL FOR SENIOR CITIZEN TRANSPORTATION (STAR)

TOTAL AMOUNT OF TAXES WHICH MAY BE LEVIED ON ALL TAXABLE REAL AND PERSONAL PROPERTY BE INCREASED BY ONE-QUARTER (1/4) OF ONE (1) MILL FOR EACH ONE (\$1.00) DOLLAR (\$0.25 FOR EACH \$1,000.00) OF THE TAXABLE VALUE OF SUCH PROPERTY FOR A PERIOD OF FOUR (4) YEARS FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING FUNDS FOR SENIOR CITIZEN AND PERMANENTLY DISABLED TRANSPORTATION SERVICES? THIS PROPOSED MILLAGE IS A RENEWAL OF A PREVIOUSLY AUTHORIZED MILLAGE.

3. ALMONT COMMUNITY SCHOOLS BOND PROPOSAL

Shall Almont Community Schools, Lapeer, St. Clair, Macomb and Oakland Counties, Michigan, borrow the sum of not to exceed Twenty-Two Million Six Hundred Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$22,680,000) and issue its general obligation unlimited tax bonds therefor, for the purpose of: erecting, furnishing and equipping additions to the high school building; remodeling, furnishing and refurnishing and equipping and re-equipping school buildings; and erecting, preparing, developing, improving and equipping playgrounds, athletic fields, facilities and structures and sites?

The following is for informational purposes only:

The estimated millage that will be levied for the proposed bonds in 2024, under current law, is 1.50 mills (\$1.50 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation). The maximum number of years the bonds may be outstanding, exclusive of any refunding, is fifteen (15) years. The estimated simple average annual millage anticipated to be required to retire this bond debt is 3.28 mills (\$3.28 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation).

The school district does not expect to borrow from the State to pay debt service on the bonds. The total amount of qualified bonds currently outstanding is \$7,620,000. The total amount of qualified loans currently outstanding is \$0. The estimated computed millage rate may change based on changes in certain circumstances.

4. ALMONT COMMUNITY SCHOOLS BOND PROPOSAL

Shall Almont Community Schools, Lapeer, St. Clair, Macomb and Oakland Counties, Michigan, borrow the sum of not to exceed Ten Million Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$10,050,000) and issue its general obligation unlimited tax bonds therefor, for the purpose of: erecting, furnishing and equipping an addition to the primary school building; remodeling school buildings; and preparing, developing and improving playgrounds, athletic fields and sites?

The following is for informational purposes only:

The estimated millage that will be levied for the proposed bonds in 2024, under current law, is 1.10 mills (\$1.10 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation). The maximum number of years the bonds may be outstanding, exclusive of any refunding, is ten (10) years. The estimated simple average annual millage anticipated to be required to retire this bond debt is 2.13 mills (\$2.13 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation).

The school district does not expect to borrow from the State to pay debt service on the bonds. The total amount of qualified bonds currently outstanding is \$7,620,000. The total amount of

qualified loans currently outstanding is \$0. The estimated computed millage rate may change based on changes in certain circumstances.

(Pursuant to State law, expenditure of bond proceeds must be audited and the proceeds cannot be used for repair or maintenance costs, teacher, administrator or employee salaries, or other operating expenses.)

On Monday, August 5, 2024 absentee ballots must be voted in person at the Clerk's office up until 4:00 p.m.
